<p>Permit conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Comox Valley Regional District shall issue a permit to an applicant upon payment of a fee in the amount of \$30.00. 2. Permits WILL NOT BE ISSUED OR BE VALID during Stage 3 or 4 restrictions. 3. If this permit is issued for new sod, the permit is valid for 21 days after the date of installation. 4. If this permit is issued for newly seeded lawn, the permit is valid for 49 days after date of installation or until growth is established whichever is less. 5. During the term of the permit, the permit holder may sprinkle the new sod or newly seeded lawn outside of permitted days between the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 am and 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm during Stage 1 restrictions, between the hours of 6:00 am to 8:00 am and 8:00 pm to 10:00 pm during Stage 2 restrictions and at any time if watering is done by a hand held hose equipped with an automatic shut-off nozzle. 6. This permit is to be prominently displayed at the residence for which the permit is issued. 7. During Stage 3 and 4 there is no lawn watering allowed.
