

2025-2029 Recommended Plan - Operating





Operating Budget - Proposed to Recommended \$10 MM Change

Key Changes

- 265 Search and Rescue: \$100,000 increase to support CVGSAR facility needs
- > 450 Emergency Shelter Land Acquisition: (\$500,000) decrease as a result of moving to foundational strategic option.
- > 124 Hornby Island Grant In Aid: \$7,500 increase grants
- > 500 Planning: (\$320,000) reduction resulting from the use of 2024 surplus and FFE reserve
- 555 Denman Island Economic Development: (\$23,000) reduction in operational grant
- 670 Hornby Island Community Facilities: \$10,000 increase in grant to Hornby Island Arts Council
- 625 Regional Parks and Trails: (\$144,500) reduction –deferral of personnel and decrease in reserve contributions
- 2024 carry forward projects of \$3.02 MM and surplus of \$6.87 MM



2025-2029 Proposed Financial Plan - Capital





Capital Budget- Proposed to Recommended \$41.0 MM Change

- 2024 Carry forward Capital Projects of \$41.0 MM incorporated into 2025 recommended budget including:
 - Sewer conveyance upgrades \$20.6 MM
 - Water South Services Extension \$5.5 MM
 - Royston conversion to CV Water \$2.5 MM
 - Mt. Washington Fire Hall \$2.5 MM


